On page 213 at the end of the first paragraph in the right-hand column, part of the paragraph was omitted. The last three sentences should read as follows: "Two intercept shifters are included to control for differences in responses depending on whether respondents had heard about bST prior to receiving the survey (HEARD) and to allow for differences attributable to the two different descriptions of the technology provided (FORM). Lastly, a continuous variable is included to account for current average weekly household purchases of milk (CONSUMPTION). The unweighted observations were used in this and all subsequent regression models."

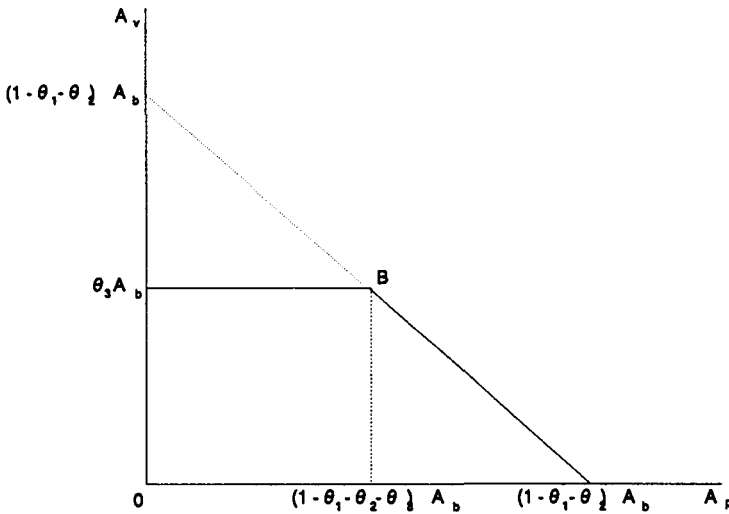


Figure 1. Substitution Between Program Planted and Voluntary Diversion Acreage

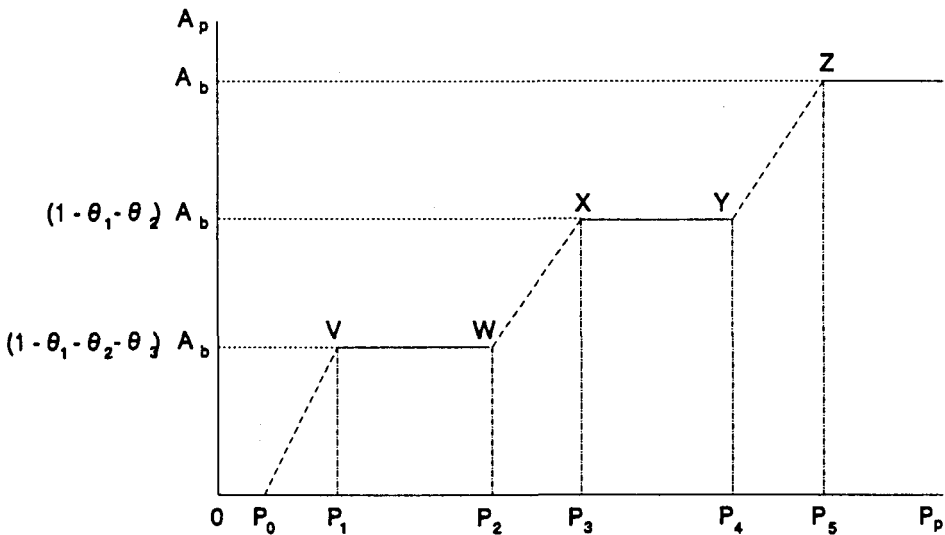


Figure 2. Acreage Response Under Different Policy Regimes
