Accounts of the life of the great modern apostle, Fray Junípero Serra, and his labors in the Franciscan Missions of California have been multiplying in recent years. All of them have stemmed from the present biography by his faithful co-worker and devoted friend, Fray Francisco Palóu.

In this volume Dr. Geiger, noted authority on the life of Father Serra, offers a very readable translation from the original Spanish. The abundant documentation, in itself a notable contribution to historical scholarship, provides a wealth of material on the history of the West.

Art work in the Old Missions was not merely ornamental. It was a "visual aid" employed in the Christian instruction of the Indians. The *padres* were always adding to the mission collections with appropriate foreign reproductions and pieces done by the natives themselves. With the secularization of the Missions and their gradual abandonment, more and more of these treasures found their way to Mission Santa Barbara, and it has become a rich depository of early California art.

Dr. Baer has for the first time attempted a comprehensive description and evaluation of this interesting collection. More than 150 photographs of the originals at the Mission, with the author's explanatory text for each, constitute a unique study of this phase of California mission history.

Many volumes have been written concerning Fray Junipero Serra and his work. These volumes were written *by* Serra. They contain his letters to relatives, official reports, descriptions of the Indians, census lists, memoranda on crops and herds, suggestions to the viceroys and other officials, certifications of the founding of new missions. All are published here for the first time in one collection; some, such as the original diary of the journey to San Diego in 1769, are published for the first time anywhere. All can be read in Serra's own words or in a facing English translation. These volumes present the story of the founding of California by one who helped to found it.
