The following publications are currently available from Singapore University Press under the Special Publications Series of the *Journal of Southeast Asian Studies*:

SP-1. *The Tragedy of Wanit: A Japanese Account of Wartime Thai Politics*. By Benjamin A. Batson and Shimizu Hajime.

'The Tragedy of Wanit' is a memoir of Thai politics at the outbreak of the Pacific War, written in the 1950s by Asada Shunsuke, a senior Japanese diplomat serving in Bangkok during the critical pre-war period. The central figure is Wanit Pananon, a confidant of Thai Prime Minister Phibun and, until his arrest and death in mysterious circumstances in early 1944, a key figure in Thai-Japanese relations. Asada's memoir is published both in Japanese and in an edited English translation, together with an introduction by Benjamin A. Batson and Shimizu Hajime which explains the historical context and discusses some of the implications of Asada's work.

SP-2. *A Vietnamese Scholar in Anguish: Nguyễn Khuyến and the Decline of the Confucian Order, 1884–1909*. By Tran My-Van.

Nguyễn Khuyến was a senior Mandarin in Vietnam when the French established colonial control over the country. Around 1884 he withdrew from public life, returning to his ancestral village where he worked as a farmer and wrote trenchant poetry commenting on social life in Vietnam. This literary work reflects his feeling of anguish as he watched the decline of traditional mores, and it provides poignant insights into Vietnamese life during this period of change. The text includes translations of a number of Nguyễn Khuyến's poems, and appendices reproduce his work both in the Romanized Vietnamese script and in Chinese characters.

SP-3. *Malaya and Singapore During the Japanese Occupation*. Edited by Paul H. Kratoska.

The five pieces which make up this collection examine the experiences of the Malayan population under Japanese Occupation between early 1942 and August 1945. Abu Talib Ahmad discusses relations between the Japanese and the Malay/Muslim population, while Yoji Akashi and Hara Fujio consider the Chinese population. The other two articles, by Patricia Lim Pui Huen and Henry Frei look at how the occupation is remembered in Japan and in Malaya. Taken as a whole, this volume offers a fresh look at the occupation and its consequences for the people of Malaya and of Japan.
