The *Judicial Reports / Recueils judiciaires* of the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (ICTY) comprise (in English and French) all public indictments, as well as Decisions and Judgements issued in a given year. It will give lawyers, scholars, students and the general public convenient access to the historic work of the ICTY, which was established pursuant to United Nations Security Council Resolution 827 in 1993 to try individuals accused of serious violations of international humanitarian law committed in the territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991.

The *Judicial Reports* are organized chronologically by case. Within each case, one will find the text of indictments, reviews of indictments and where applicable, deferral requests. Thereafter the text of a public review of the indictment pursuant to Rule 61 may follow. The publication also contains the texts of the Orders, Decisions and Judgements, as well as the separate and/or dissenting opinions that may accompany a given Trial Chamber or Appeals Chamber ruling.

The *Judicial Reports* will contribute to a greater knowledge of the judicial activities of the ICTY. Various annexes, such as a table of cases, a list of Indictments and Indictees, a table of Deferrals and of Rule 61 Procedures, as well as a table of references facilitate the use of these volumes.

Les *Judicial Reports / Recueils judiciaires* du Tribunal pénal international pour l'ex-Yougoslavie (TPIY) contiennent (aussi bien en français qu'en anglais) tous les Actes d'accusation publics, ainsi que les Décisions, Arrêts et Jugements, rendus au cours d'une année donnée. Ils permettront aux praticiens du droit, universitaires et étudiants, ainsi qu'au grand public, d'accéder aisément aux travaux historiques du TPIY, lequel est habilité, en vertu de la Résolution 827 du Conseil de sécurité des Nations Unies (1993) à juger les personnes présumées responsables de violations graves du droit international humanitaire commises sur le territoire de l'ex-Yougoslavie depuis 1991.

Les *Recueils judiciaires* sont organisés de manière chronologique affaire par affaire. Sous l'intitulé de chaque affaire, on trouvera le texte des Actes d'accusation et de leur examen. Le cas échéant, les textes des demandes de dessaisissement et/ou de l'examen en audience publique d'un Acte d'accusation, conformément à l'article 61 du Règlement de procédure et de preuve, y figureront. Les *Recueils* contiennent aussi le texte des ordonnances, Décisions, Arrêts et Jugements, ainsi que les opinions individuelles ou dissidentes qui les accompagnent.

Les *Recueils judiciaires* contribueront à une connaissance plus approfondie de l'activité judiciaire du TPIY. Plusieurs annexes, tels qu'une table des affaires, une table des Actes d'accusation et des accusés, une table des dessaisissements, ainsi qu'une table des audiences dites de l'article 61 et une table des références, faciliteront l'usage de ces tomes.

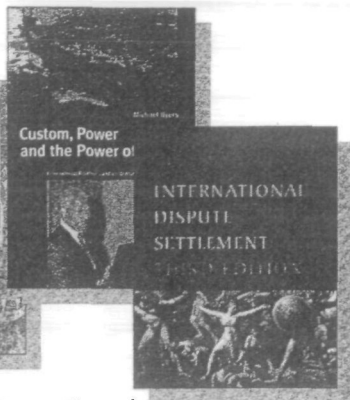
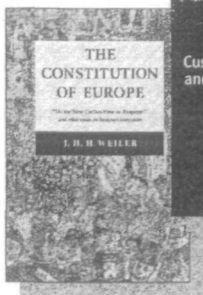

# HUMAN RIGHTS AS GENERAL NORMS AND A STATE'S RIGHT TO OPT OUT : RESERVATIONS AND OBJECTIONS TO HUMAN RIGHTS CONVENTIONS

This book analyses one of the most pressing problems of human rights and treaty law: how is the protection of universal individual human rights to be reconciled with the right of States to qualify their treaty obligations by reservations?

The development of treaties protecting fundamental human rights in clear terms is one of the major achievements of public international law in the second half of the twentieth century. They create a network of individual rights recognised and accepted by States and subject to a variety in independent mechanisms of reporting review and adjudication.

These treaties are nevertheless established under a regime of public international law which recognises the sovereignty of States and their concomitant right to limit their obligations by the extent of their consent.

This tension creates conceptual, policy and practical problems which at either extreme of the argument seem to threaten the two vital premises that human rights are a fundamental minimum on the one hand and that States are sovereign to determine the scope of their obligations on the other.

These problems have been brought into sharp relief by the welcome increase in the number of ratifications of human rights treaties which offers the prospect of universal protection for the first time, and the accompanying growth in reservations entered by the new parties.

The contributors to this volume review the interplay of these conflicting principles in the practical operation and interpretation of the eight principal human rights treaties and, with an authoritative introduction by HE Judge Rosalyn Higgins, make a first coherent analysis of this important issue in the protection of human rights and the operation of treaty law.
