

Bold new economic policies are supplanting traditional notions about the relationship between national and international markets throughout Latin America. Regional integration and neoliberal reforms

have combined to overturn more traditional approaches to national development in the region. This volume captures the content of these changes and analyzes their implications for the Western Hemisphere. Prospects for strengthening the separate



integration arrangements are suggested, and proposals for consolidating them into a hemispherewide free trade area are analyzed.

Contributors are economists and authorities on

trade reform and developments in regional integration from Latin America, the United States, and Canada. European and Japanese experts also examine current changes in the Western Hemisphere from their perspectives.


