The second series of lectures associated with the Visiting Professorship in Psychoanalysis (University College London) will be held from 20 January to 10 March 1975. Eight distinguished speakers, most of whom are practising psychoanalysts, will give lectures on the social, psychological and cultural implications of psychoanalysis as follows:

- 3 February, 1975—Psychoanalysis and the Literary Imagination: Dr. Charles Rycroft.
- 10 February 1975—Orestes and Oedipus: a structural Analysis: Dr. André Green.
- 17 February 1975—The Good Society and the Aims of Psychoanalysis: Professor Elliott Jaques.
- 24 February 1975—Violent Social Change and the Psychologist: Mr. H. P. Hildebrand.
- 3 March 1975—The Significance of Piaget's Work for Psychoanalysis: Mrs. Anne-Marie Sandler.
- 10 March 1975—The Psychoanalyst and Medicine: Mrs. Enid Balint.

All the lectures will be held at 5.30 p.m. at University College London in the Chemistry Auditorium, Christopher Ingold Laboratories, Gordon Street, London, W.C.1.

Two-Stream Residential Revision Course for the M.R.C.Psych. and D.P.M.
