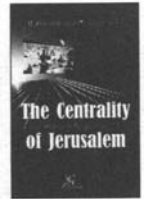
### **The Centrality of Jerusalem Historical Perspectives**

This book will be of interest to epigraphists, students of ancient history and those working on the New Testament and patristics. Its bibliography aims at being comprehensive as far as numismatic, epigraphic and archaeological studies on Philippi are concerned. Whereas the first chapter is devoted to the situation in Philippi, the bulk of the book (Chapters 2 – 4) deals with the Christian texts concerning Philippi. The inscriptions from Philippi (a catalogue of which will be published in volume II of the present study) shed new light on Paul's 'favourite congre-

gation'. The book suggests that Luke himself was a 'man from Macedonia', a member of the congregation of Philippi, who writes as a patriot about this stage of Paul's mission in Aegean lands.
