

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF THE SCOTT POLAR RESEARCH INSTITUTE

May 24, 1941.

The Committee of Management of the Scott Polar Research Institute beg leave to report to the Senate as follows:

Owing to the removal of many of the exhibits the building has been closed to the visiting public throughout the academical year: other activities have been maintained, however, including the regular issue of *The Polar Record*.

In January 1941 the two upper floors of the building were requisitioned for Government work, and the tenancy of two rooms by the Society for the Protection of Science and Learning has been terminated.

Recently some of the windows of the building were damaged by blast, but its contents escaped damage and repairs have been executed.

Mrs Wright, Assistant to the Director since 1938, will be leaving in the near future, and the Committee would like to take this opportunity of placing on record their appreciation of her loyal and efficient service.

Amongst the list of gifts appended,¹ two call for special mention: Dr Lindgren has left with us, partly on loan and partly as a gift, her fine collection of Arctic clothing and equipment, together with receptacles for storage. Mr J. Behr's gift of ten guineas for a special steel cabinet was also most welcome.
