## Merger Control in the EEC



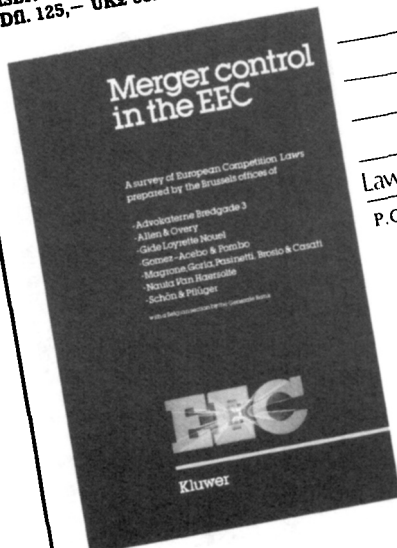
If so, you should be aware of possible changes in law and practice which may enable the European Commission to regulate major mergers which produce effects at Community level (including those taking place only in one Member State).

In the past the Commission's powers have been severely limited by the absence of a specific merger control provision in the Treaty of Rome and by the view that mergers fall outside Article 85. However, in the recently decided case of Phillip Morris/Rothmans, the European Court has a rare opportunity to consider the application of Articles 85 and 86 to the acquisition by one company of a substantial shareholding in a competitor.

This book, produced at a crucial moment provides up-to-date commentary on the national competition laws in the EEC which regulate mergers producing effects within individual Member States. It also includes a highly topical chapter summarising indeed the present and likely future position under EEC Law.

Aimed at lawyers, in-house counsel and merchant bankers with the legal steps of merger control in mind, this book is also required reading for company directors or executives.

## **NOTES FOR THE CONTRIBUTORS**

The editors welcome articles from students, scholars and practitioners who deal with international law.

The editors are willing to consider proposals for articles although they are unable to make any undertaking about publication in advance of submission of the manuscript.

The average length of the manuscript should range from:

- 4000 to 6000 words for Leading Articles,
- 5000 to 7000 words for Student Contributions,
- 3000 to 4000 words for Current Legal Developments.

The manuscript should be written in English and be submitted in duplicate with both the text and footnotes typed and double spaced on A4 paper (legal format). Preferably manuscripts should also be submitted on word processing diskettes compatible with the IBM PC system, if possible using WordPerfect software.

Authors are also asked to submit an abstract of their contribution not exceeding 100 words.

Authors should indicate their current affiliations and what brief personal details they would like to appear under their names.

The Editorial Staff will only consider original, unpublished work which is not being submitted for publication elsewhere.

All manuscripts submitted to the Journal will be subjected to review by the editors before being accepted for publication.

All manuscripts submitted become the property of the Journal.

Authors will not receive a fee, but will be presented with two copies of the Journal in which their contribution is published, and 10 offprints of their article.
