This book is an attempt to provide an interconnected explication of many of the central concepts of decision-making: Liking, wanting, preferring, needing; Choosing, deciding and objects of choice and decision; Resources, restrictions and possibilities; Cost, benefit, probability and grids of analysis; and Rationality. The author argues against current theories of rationality, in favour of what he calls 'consensual rationality' and concludes the work with a discussion of the ethics of decision-making.

This book should prove valuable both for those with a general interest in the theory of decision-making, and for specialists. Though the author has written two books on logic, this work is free of technical terminology.
