Typescript. Typescript, double-spaced, may be submitted in duplicate to any member of the Editorial Board. Postage for return of the typescript should be included. A bibliographical list of references cited should be headed "References," placed in alphabetical order, numbered and appended. Simple citations should then be made by employing *in the text*, rather than by footnote, the appropriate numerical reference to this list. Discursive footnotes should be numbered consecutively throughout the typescript. *Typescript should not exceed 30 typewritten pages.* A summary abstract of approximately 100 words should accompany each article submitted; such abstracts are exchanged with other journals and published subsequent to publication of an article in this journal.

Reprints. Contributors of articles to this journal will receive, gratis, 50 reprints. Authors desiring additional reprints may order them by sending in, with their corrected galleys, the special order forms which they will find enclosed with their galleys.

Reviews. Publications intended for review should be sent to Dr. JAMES VAN EVRA, Department of Philosophy, *University of Waterloo*, Waterloo, Ontario, Canada.

Philosophy of Science is published quarterly; issues are dated *March, June, September* and *December* of each year. Correspondence concerning business matters should be addressed to Dr. GERALD J.
