Dr. Taylor took part in the field machinery which dealt with the conflict between the Netherlands and the Indonesian nationalists. THE JAPANESE SEIZURE OF KOREA

The peninsula of Korea, suspended midway between China and Japan, has been throughout most of its history a source of temptation—and of conflict—to those powers. Japan fought China in 1894 to gain only shaky control of the peninsula, but it was her war with Russia in 1904 that led to the complete annexation of Korea, in 1910, to the Japanese Empire.

Dr. Conroy, Associate Professor of History at the University of Pennsylvania, has written a fascinating and authoritative account of the first phase of Japan's aggressive expansion. Containing translations or summaries of diaries and government documents, contemporary prints, and statistical tables, as well as an extensive bibliography, *The Japanese Seizure of Korea 1868-1910* is a work of paramount importance for all students of the Far East and for everyone interested in the theory and practice of international relations.
