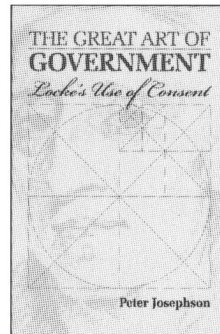
Peter Josephson

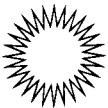
