Cambridge Studies in English Legal History

This book is a study of county government by justices of the peace, at a period when the Tudor system was falling into decay and in an area where urban conditions made the difficulties especially great. Administrative problems are studied in detail in connection with the maintenance of law and order, the poor law, highways, labour questions and other economic matters; and the need for reform is clearly brought out. Careful estimates are made of the extent to which old regulations, while remaining legally in force, had become inoperative and given place to practical *laissez-faire*.
