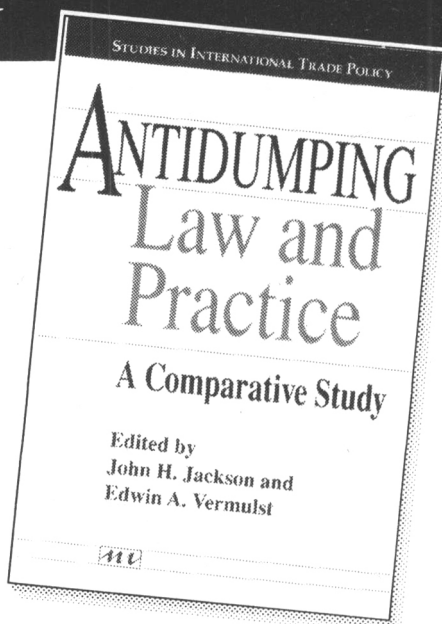

LOCAL REMEDIES IN INTERNATIONAL LAW

This book examines the local remedies rule in modern international law generally and also in the area of human rights protection. The law is presented in the light of State practice and the jurisprudence of international courts and tribunals.

The author not only discusses the jurisprudential basis of the rule and its established aspects but ventures into some important areas, such as the incidence of the rule, limitations, the burden of proof, and the application of the rule to procedural remedies, in which the law is not so clear. While there is a strict adherence to the requirements of juristic exposition and analysis where the law has been more or less determined, the author does not hesitate to offer criticisms and to make suggestions for improvement of the law in the light of modern policy considerations. The book takes into account the recent work on the subject by the International Law Commission which has not hitherto been examined.

There is also an appendix on the relevance of the rule to the law relating to international organizations.

The problem of maritime delimitation is one of the most disputed questions in international law. Out of the several hundred situations calling for maritime delimitation, only about a hundred have so far been settled. Numerous negotiations are under way, and several cases will come before international tribunals over the next few years.

The purpose of this book is to assess the meaning and scope of the solutions already reached, to submit them to critical analysis, to identify the directions in which the evolution of the law is headed, and to advance some suggestions as to desirable developments. Particularly in the light of the judgment of the International Court of Justice in the *Libya/Malta* case, Professor Weil argues cogently in favour of equidistance as a starting point, modified as necessary by reference to equitable considerations.
