During the years since publication of the first edition of this book there have been rapid and far-reaching changes in the laws of Common-law Africa, and the courts have undergone the most profound transformation. This book concentrates mainly on the courts, but now includes more reference to the sources and characteristics of the main branches of the law in each country. Each chapter deals with one country and the standard pattern of arrangement makes the book largely self-indexing.
