The Harvard Concordance to Shakespeare is the first definitive one-volume Shakespeare concordance—a milestone in publishing history.

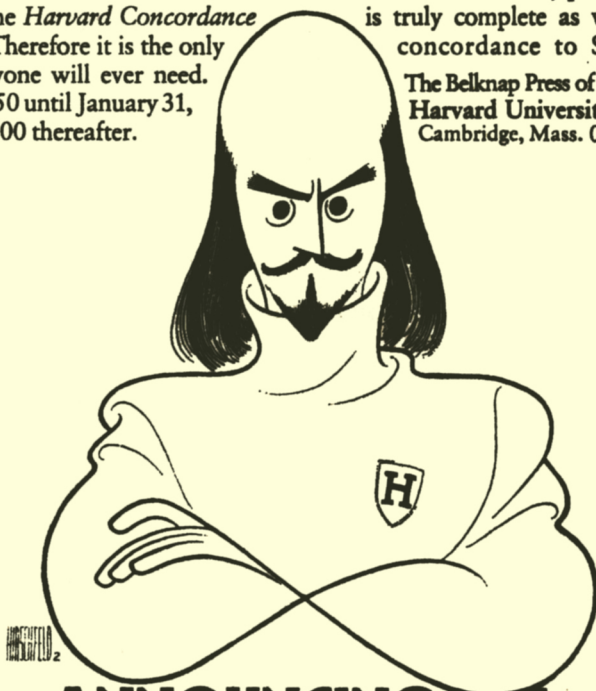

The *Harvard Concordance* was compiled over a nine-year period by Professor Marvin Spevack with the aid of a computer.
