The introduction and epilogue by Maisie Ward are admirable in emphasizing the essential trust in God which was at the root of Mary Ward's spirituality, and in calling attention to the late Pope's wish that the apostolic spirit of that 'incomparable woman' should be an inspiration for our own time. The format of the book is attractive and it is pleasing to note that the most authentic of the known portraits, the Augsburg one, has been chosen for the dust jacket. It is to be hoped that in any future edition it will appear in less ephemeral form, perhaps as a frontispiece.
