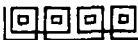

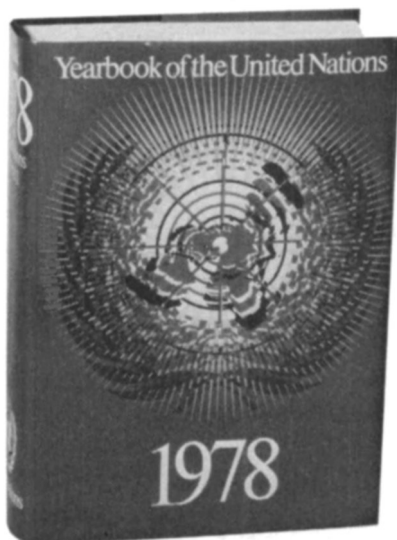

Professor Lele insists that the politicians of Maharashtra sustain, however dispersed, a hegemonic class rule. 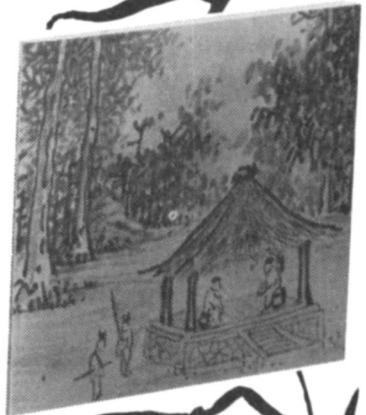
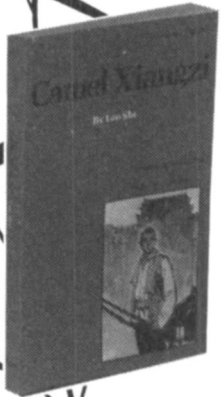
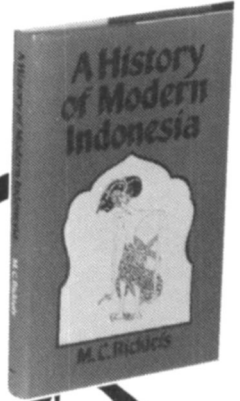
