- a library of around 100,000 volumes and 540 current periodicals, maintained jointly with the Hellenic Society and in conjunction with the University of London's Institute of Classical Studies. - summer schools, etc. by the annual award of grants
- archaeology, through grants for excavations and by organising a biennial conference
- schools, by the award of grants to help the teaching of all aspects of the Roman world
- a programme of public lectures in London, and others outside London arranged with local branches of the Classical Association

**Membership** is open to all; no entrance fee or professional qualification is required. Members are entitled to:

- receive annually either the *JRS* or *Britannia* or both
- receive advance notice of forthcoming monographs at special offer prices
- use the library and borrow the Society's books and slides, either in person or by post, while living or resident in the UK
- attend the Society's lectures, of which a programme is circulated in September
- purchase back issues of the journals (see back page)
