THE FIFTH SYMPOSIUM ON MIDDLE-EAR SURGERY

THE Symposium will be held at the Theodor Heuss Academy and at the Municipal City Hospital in Gummersbach (Cologne), West Germany, 5-11 July, 1976.

COURSE IN NEUROTOLOGY

22 MARCH THROUGH 25, 1976

THE Department of Otolaryngology of the Abraham Lincoln School of Medicine and the University of Illinois Hospital Eye and Ear Infirmary, University of Illinois at the Medical Center, will conduct a continuing education course in Neurotology, 22 March through 25, 1976.

The four day intensive course will offer a didactic and practical review of clinical neurotology under the direction of Nicholas Torok, M.D. It will be held at the Eye and Ear Infirmary and will include basic vestibular physiology and pathophysiology, commonly used testing methods applied in functional examination of the vestibular organ. Various forms of caloric testing procedures will be demonstrated using nystagmography, reading and evaluation of the test results, particularly the nystagmogram, and correlation with audiometric and neurologic findings, final neurotological diagnosis, management and treatment. Patients will be tested by participants and the history, symptoms and test results will be discussed in informal conferences.
