It includes provisions to a number of bishoprics and archbishoprics including Ardee, Ardagh, Armagh, Carlisle, Derry and Worcester; and to monasteries including Canon Island, Dryburgh, Kelso and Scone. Large numbers of obscure parochial clergy, rectors,

vicars and chaplains are also mentioned. These are the working documents of the Church about the time of the publication of Luther's 95 Theses. This book is an essential companion to Vol. XX in the series.

In the case of Scotland, Wales and Ireland they are the single most important source of ecclesiastical reference for the period.
