Small Grants Fund

The Parkes Foundation has set up a Small Grants Fund to help promote research into the biosocial sciences. Priority will be given to the support of field work which involves the integrated study of biological and social features of human populations. Relevant disciplines are anthropology, demography and population studies, ecology and environmental studies, nutrition and population genetics.

Grants will be particularly directed to help graduate research students to meet field and travel costs, but others may apply. Undergraduate projects, however, will not be supported. Grants will be small, usually not exceeding £500, and successful candidates will need to provide a report following completion of the work.

Applicants should provide a short statement of the proposed research, a budget, a *curriculum vitae* and the names of two referees. Application forms may be obtained from the address below. The closing date for applications is the end of each calendar year, and awards will be made early in the following year.
